This is the obvious water washed black arete on the far left side of the Main Wall. Climb up to a high bolt through moderate climbing to an interesting stance before some powerful climbing on the few features available. 7 bolts

Start 10 feet right of Leap of Faith. Identify this one by its striking gold break at mid-height. Don't be shy. Annie Sprinkles will educate you in the fine art of hanging onto large, downturned slopes. Many will blow-off on the mid-height crux but for those that hang in there they will remember Annie Sprinkles as one of the best they ever had. 5bolts

Evolution Number Nine 12b/c
Start 5 feet right of Annie Sprinkles. This line follows a series of vertical cracks and grooves. The weak will be weeded out quickly on the opening moves of this one, while the upper section will challenge you in every single way. Have your buddy put some chalk on these typically bare routes, as the near featureless perfection of this wall makes reading routes very difficult. 6 bolts. Porter Jarrard 1990

Monkey Boy 12a
Start 15 feet right of Evolution Number Nine. Worth the walk from anywhere! This route is found in the middle of the wall and is the warmup for the area. Less demanding moves, albeit sustained climbing up gorgeous stone, will deliver you at the base of a final redpoint crux testing your evolutionary commitment to climb. 6 bolts. Chris Chestnut 1990

Arms Control 12b/c ***
Start 15 feet right of Monkey Boy. Prepare yourself! Lock down for the powerful start, load it back in the middle refs, and give em' hell at the top. Stay on the offensive on this one! 6 bolts

The Next to the Last Boy Scout 12c/d ***
Start same as the Last Boy Scout. Easier climbing leads up until you hit the blank face up high. This route has a more technical and thinner bout of climbing than most on the wall. 5 bolts.

DEEP CREEK **DEEP CREEK**

Sloppy seconds 12a
Start 10 feet right of previous corner. Overcome a low roof to a ledge. Climb a beautiful vertical white face to steepening terrain up high.

Proven Ground 12a
Start 20 feet right of the previous route. From atop a ledge, climb out a tiered system of overhangs (crux) and then back left accessing a crack system cutting hard left. Follow this weakness to the base of a spectacular overhang grate follow it to the top. For all-around movement, wall position, and rock quality - this route has proven itself to be one of the best routes at Deep Creek. John Dierweg

Whipping Post 12a
Start 10 feet right of Proven Ground. An immediate dynamic sequence leads to sustained punny terrain. A tricky heel-hook maneuver (crux) at mid-height leads to a sculpted jug finish. Sometimes it feel like you've been tied to the Whipping Post. The crux of this route will beat your ass if you let it.

Free Rider 13a
Start 8 feet right of Whipping Post. Standard 12' climbing leads to an all-out dyno. Finish on the vertical face above. Sean has an eye for a boulder problem - having established some of the best boulders in the region. Even when he breaks out the drill, boulder problems still find him, as they did on this route. Dyno!

Start same as Free Rider. Identify this route by its massive flat roof. Climb a steep bulging face that leads to the base of a large 25 foot flat roof. Blaze out this beast, past small edges and sidepulls. Collect Collie! Collie! Collie!

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




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


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
